Management Personnel Plan (MPP) faculty shall forfeit all 2 Senate-sanctioned voting rights as herein defined until such time 3 as they return to the tenure-track ranks. 4 5 Additional restrictions may be placed on voter eligibility in the 3. Bylaws of the Faculty Senate or in policy documents establishing 6 special committees. 7 8 C. Faculty on paid leave shall retain all powers to vote. Section 2. Powers 9 A. The Faculty shall have the power to formulate, adopt, review and revise 10 recommendations relating to the policies and operation of the University, 11 12 subject to the laws of the State of California, the regulations of the 13 Trustees of the California State University, and the Memorandum of Understanding. 14 15 B. The Faculty shall normally exercise its powers through the Faculty Senate of the University elected by, and representative of, the Faculty and subject 16 17 to its review. C. Faculty or Faculty Senate recommendations shall become University 18 19 policy after adoption by the University President. 20 Section 3. Officers 21 The officers of the Faculty shall be the President of the University or designee, 22 the Chair of the Faculty Senate and the Executive Secretary of the Faculty 23 Senate, who shall serve as the Secretary of the Faculty. 24 Section 4. Faculty Meetings and Duties of Faculty Officers 25 A. The President or designee shall call at least one faculty meeting during the academic year and may call special meetings whenever necessary. At 26 27 these meetings the President or designee shall preside. 28 B. The Chair of the Faculty Senate shall call a meeting of the Faculty 29 whenever a majority of the total membership of the Faculty Senate so 30 requests. At such meetings the Chair of the Faculty Senate shall preside. 31 C. The Chair of the Faculty Senate shall call a meeting of the Faculty whenever it is requested by a petition of ten percent of the Faculty. At 32

- such meetings the Chair of the Faculty Senate shall preside unless the
 Faculty elects to choose a chair *pro tem*. The chair *pro tem* shall be
 elected by a majority of those present.

- 15 Section 1. Membership
- 16 The Faculty Senate shall consist of area representatives, members at large and17 ex-officio members.
- 18 A. The following are the areas from which faculty shall elect representatives:
- 19 1. Library
- 20 2. School of Business and Public Administration
- 21 3. School of Education
- 22 4. School of Humanities
- 23 5. School of Natural Sciences
- 6. School of Social and Behavioral Sciences
- 25 7. Student Services Professionals Academic Related
- 26 Senate seats from these seven areas shall be apportioned according to the
- 27 following formula with the proviso that each area shall have at least one seat:
 - Number of faculty in unit x 27

1 Total number of faculty 2 If the decimal part of this number is greater than or equal to 0.5, the number shall be raised to the next highest integer, otherwise the decimal part shall be 3 4 dropped. The resulting number shall be the number of seats for the unit. 5 This formula shall be implemented during the Winter Quarter prior to electing 6 Faculty Senators. The Faculty Senate so elected shall remain valid for the entire following academic year regardless of any change in number of faculty in any of 7 the areas. 8 9 B. An at-large Lecturer's representative shall be elected during the regular Spring election cycle by and from full-time annual lecturers to serve until 10 the end of the next academic year. 11 12 C. Ex-officio members shall consist of the following: 13 1. The President of the University, who shall not vote. 2. The Vice President for Academic Affairs/Provost, who shall not 14 15 vote. 16 3. Delegates to the Academic Senate of the California State 17 University, who by election to that body become voting members of the Faculty Senate. 18 19 4. The Associated Students President, or designee approved by the 20 AS Executive Cabinet for the academic year, who shall be a voting 21 member. 22 D. Except as provided in B above, only tenure-track Faculty may serve on the Statewide Academic Senate, on the Faculty Senate, or on special or 23 24 standing committees of the Faculty Senate. E. Management Personnel Plan Faculty may not serve as elected Faculty 25 26 representatives to the Statewide Academic Senate, to the Faculty Senate, 27 or to any committee at any level established under Senate policy.

28 Section 2. Powers

29 The Faculty Senate shall be the delegate assembly of the Faculty through which the Faculty shall normally exercise its powers. All members of the Faculty have 30 31 the right to attend meetings of the Faculty Senate and may speak with the 32 consent of the Chair of the Faculty Senate, but they shall not vote. Other persons 33 may attend at the discretion of the Faculty Senate. The Faculty Senate, upon a 34 majority vote of the voting members present, may declare an executive session. 35 Any action taken by the Faculty Senate is subject to review by the Faculty and must be reviewed whenever the Faculty so requests by a petition of fifteen 36

- 1 percent of its members. The Faculty by vote of a majority of its total membership
- 2 may modify or nullify decisions of the Faculty Senate.

3 Section 3. Duties

- A. The Faculty Senate shall perform all duties consistent with the formulation, adoption, review and revision of recommendations relating to the policies
 and operation of the University, within the limits prescribed by this
 Constitution.
- B. The Faculty Senate shall create committees necessary to the performance
 of its duties. Regulations and specific charges for these committees shall
 also be established by the Faculty Senate.
- C. The Faculty Senate, by vote of a majority of its total voting membership,
 shall adopt all bylaws necessary to the performance of its duties and
 amend them when necessary. Changes in the bylaws shall not be
 proposed and voted upon at the same meeting.
- D. The Faculty Senate shall keep a record of its proceedings and shall
 distribute copies of minutes to the Faculty and to the appropriate
 administrative officers of the University.
- E. The Faculty Senate shall establish appropriate grievance procedures
 consistent with regulations of the Trustees of the California State
 University.
- 21 Section 4. Officers
- A. The officers of the Faculty Senate shall include a chair, a vice chair, and
 an executive secretary, all to be elected by and from the voting
 membership of the Faculty Senate. They shall serve for a one-year term.
- B. A Faculty Senate officer may be removed from office by a vote of two thirds of the total voting membership of the Senate.
- 27 Section 5. Term of Service and Recall
- 28 A. Term of Service

29 Members shall serve for a term of two years (with the exception of the 30 Statewide Academic Senators who are elected for three-year terms), with 31 terms so arranged that one-half of the Faculty Senate shall be elected 32 each year.

- 1 B. Recall
- Any Faculty Senator, Statewide Academic Senator or Faculty Senate standing, special, or ad hoc committee member shall be subjected to a recall election by submission of a petition signed by 25 percent of his or her electorate. Alternatively, a recall election may be initiated by the Elections Committee, after an investigation requested by a majority vote of the Senate or of the affected Senate committee.
- 8 2. A member of the Faculty Senate, the Statewide Academic Senate or
 9 Faculty Senate standing, special, or *ad hoc* committee is recalled by a
 10 two-thirds vote of his or her electorate.
- For recall purposes, the Faculty Senate shall serve as the "electorate" of
 Faculty Senate special or *ad hoc* committee members elected by the
 Faculty Senate, and the Executive Committee shall serve as the
 "electorate" of committee members appointed by the Executive
 Committee.
- 16 Section 6. Agenda

Any Faculty Senate committee or member of the Faculty may transmit to the 17 Faculty Senate Executive Committee topics for discussion and proposals for 18 19 possible action which are within the jurisdiction of the Faculty Senate. At least 20 twenty working days before the regularly scheduled meeting of the Faculty 21 Senate, the Chair of the Faculty Senate shall invite from the Faculty topics and proposals which shall be added to other business before the Faculty Senate or 22 23 referred to whichever Senate committee has jurisdiction for their review and 24 recommendation. The established agenda shall be circulated among the Faculty 25 at least three days prior to the meeting of the Faculty Senate.

- 26 Section 7. Meetings
- 27 The Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate shall call regularly scheduled
- 28 meetings of the Faculty Senate at least once a month during the academic year
- and special meetings whenever necessary. A regularly scheduled meeting may
- 30 be canceled for lack of agenda.

31 Section 8. Duration of a Faculty Senate

- 32 Each Faculty Senate shall serve for one year. The currently seated Faculty
- 33 Senate shall serve until the last day of the current academic year. However, at
- 34 the last two regularly- scheduled meetings of the academic year, the incoming
- 35 Faculty Senate for the following academic year shall be seated solely for the
- 36 purpose of necessary elections. Officers, at-large Executive Committee
- 37 members, and statewide Academic Senate Alternates shall be elected at the
- 38 next- to-last Senate meeting. The chairs of the Educational Policy and Resources

- 1 Committee and the Faculty Affairs Committee shall be elected at the last Senate
- 2 meeting.

4 ARTICLE III -- COMMITTEES OF THE FACULTY SENATE

- 5 Faculty Senate committees shall make recommendations to the Faculty Senate
- 6 regarding matters of policy, within the limits prescribed for them by the Faculty
- 7 Senate and by this Constitution and its bylaws. All committees shall report
- 8 regularly to the Faculty Senate concerning committee activities.
- 9 Section 1. Standing Committees
- 10 Section 2. The Executive Committee
- 11 Section 3. The Elections Committee
- 12 Section 4. Special and Ad Hoc Committees
- 13 _____
- 14 Section 1. Standing Committees

15 A. Standing Committees established in the Constitution shall be elected by and from the membership of the Faculty Senate, with one person coming from each 16 17 Constituent Unit. Representatives to other standing committees shall be elected by Constituent Units (preferably) or from the Schools/Library, one representative 18 19 per area elected by the faculty of that area. Chairs of the Educational Policy and 20 Resources Committee and the Faculty Affairs Committee shall be elected by the 21 Faculty Senate from among the membership of the Senate. Provisions may also be made for one administrative representative per committee and for one or 22 23 more student representatives per committee. The following shall be the 24 Constituent Units for committee representation: 25 School of Business and Public Administration 2. School of Education 26 27 3. School of Humanities and Library

- 28 4. School of Natural Sciences
- School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Student Services
 Professionals Academic Related.
- B. The Executive Committee and the Elections Committee shall be the sole
 standing committees established in this Constitution. Other standing
 committees shall be established in the bylaws of this Constitution.

1 Section 2. The Executive Committee

2	A. Membership: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair, Vice
3	Chair, and Executive Secretary of the Faculty Senate, two other members
4	of the Faculty Senate who shall serve at-large, two (2) Statewide
5	Senators, and the President or designee. Neither Statewide Senators nor
6	the President or designee shall be voting members. Each elected
7	member of the Executive Committee shall be from a different Constituent
8	Unit. The order for electing members of the Executive Committee shall be
9	Chair, Vice Chair, Executive Secretary, and Members At-Large. In
10	addition, the chair of the Educational Policies and Resources Committee
11	and the chair of the Faculty Affairs Committee shall be members of the
12	Executive Committee. Additional Statewide Senators resulting from re-
13	appointment will rotate on and off in an equitable manner determined by
14	the Executive Committee and with a continuing maximum of two (2) ex-
15	officio positions.

- 16 B. Duties:
- 17 1. The Executive Committee shall prepare the agenda for and schedule the 18 meetings of the Faculty Senate.
- The Executive Committee shall refer to relevant committees those issues
 that it deems suitably significant from whatever source; however, the
 Executive Committee may re-refer an item back to committee only once
 after the first assignment to said body. Following final receipt of referred
 or re-referred items from relevant committees, the Executive Committee
 shall forward said items to the Senate as a whole for consideration.
- The Executive Committee shall interpret the meaning and intent of all
 articles of the Constitution and bylaws except as specified in Article II,
 Section 3, Part J of the bylaws.
- 4. The Executive Committee shall make appropriate nominations and
 appointments to campus committees when necessary.
- 30 5. Other duties of the Executive Committee shall include, but may not be
 31 limited to, acting on behalf of the Faculty Senate when the Senate is not
 32 meeting regularly, such as in the summer.
- 33 Section 3. The Elections Committee
- A. Membership: The Vice Chair of the Faculty Senate shall serve as the
 Chair of the Elections Committee and be the representative of his or her
 constituent unit. The Faculty Senate shall elect from its voting membership
 one representative from each remaining constituent unit.
- B. Duties: The Elections Committee shall administer all provisions of Articles
 11 and III of the bylaws.

1 Section 4. Special and Ad Hoc Committees

The Senate may establish special and ad hoc committees to serve special needs
at the University. These shall be established in Senate policy documents in

- 4 conformance with procedures established in the Bylaws. Faculty representation
- 5 shall normally be by Constituent Unit or by School/Library. There may also be at
- 6 large faculty representatives and representatives from other areas of the campus
- 7 community.

9 ARTICLE IV -- ADOPTION OF THIS CONSTITUTION

10 Approval by a majority vote of the Faculty, as defined in Article 1, Section 1, shall 11 be necessary for the adoption of this Constitution.

13 ARTICLE V -- REVISION OF THIS CONSTITUTION

An ad hoc committee on constitutional revision shall be convened at least every
 four years after the adoption of this Constitution to ensure that this Constitution is
 sufficient to the growth of the University.

A. Membership: One representative from each constituent unit, elected by the Faculty Senate and one member designated by the University President.

- B. Duties: This committee shall initiate and review proposals for revision of
 the Constitution and bylaws of the Faculty Senate and make appropriate
 recommendations to the Senate.

- 29 Section 1. Initiation of a Referendum

Last Revision 2005

- 1 A. The Faculty Senate, by majority vote, may initiate a referendum of the 2 Faculty on proposed amendments to the Constitution.
- B. A referendum on amendments to this Constitution may also be initiated by
 a petition of twenty percent of the Faculty.
- 5 Section 2. Approval of Amendments
- 6 Ratification of proposed amendments to this constitution shall require a two-
- 7 thirds affirmative vote of all valid ballots cast. The ratification election shall be
- 8 conducted by the Elections Committee. All members of the faculty, except faculty
- 9 on full-time leave of absence without pay, shall be eligible to vote. A copy of
- 10 proposed amendments shall be sent to every faculty member at least one week
- 11 before ballots are distributed. A minimum of ten working days shall be provided
- 12 from the day that ballots are distributed to the deadline for receiving ballots in the
- 13 Senate Office.
