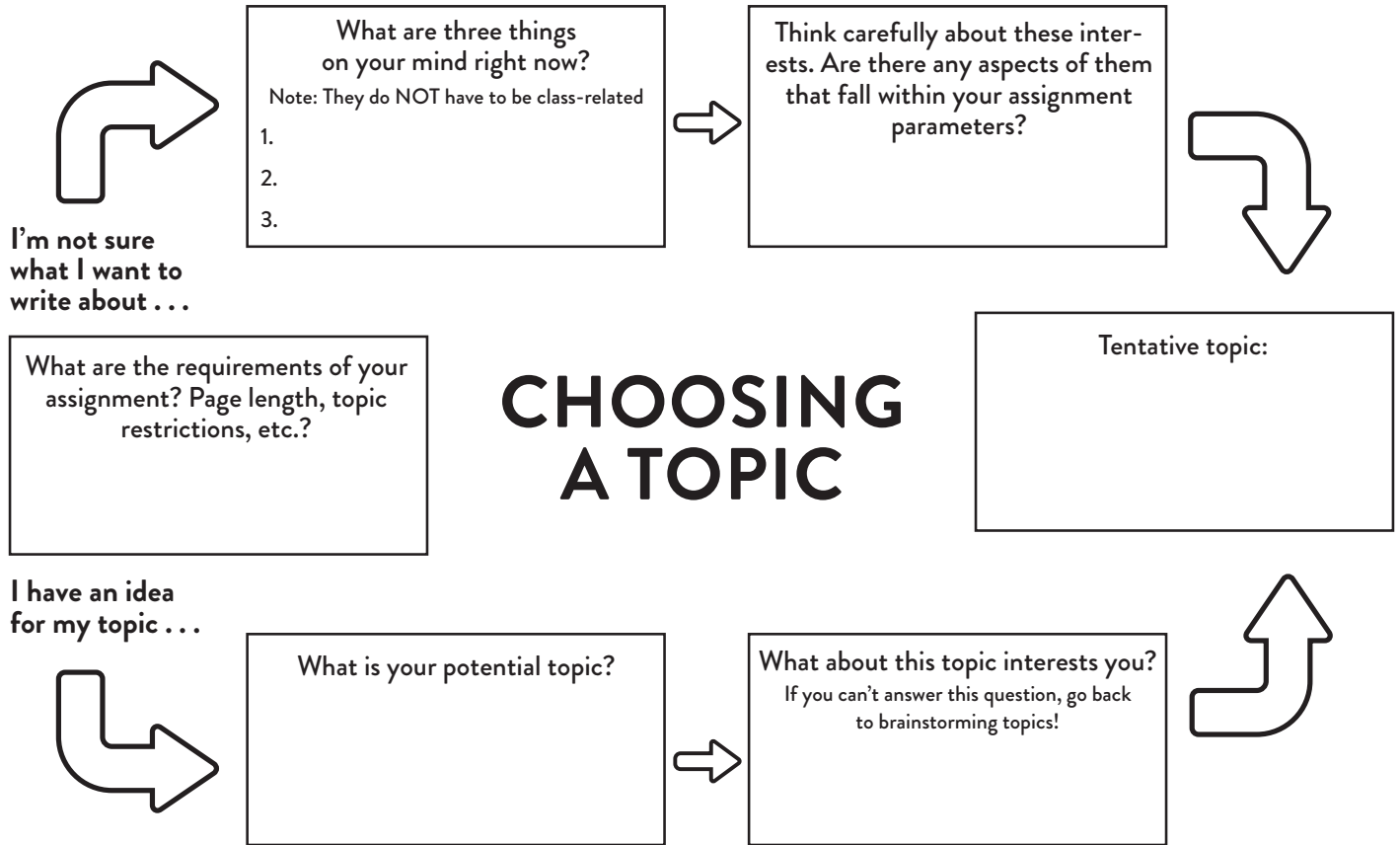
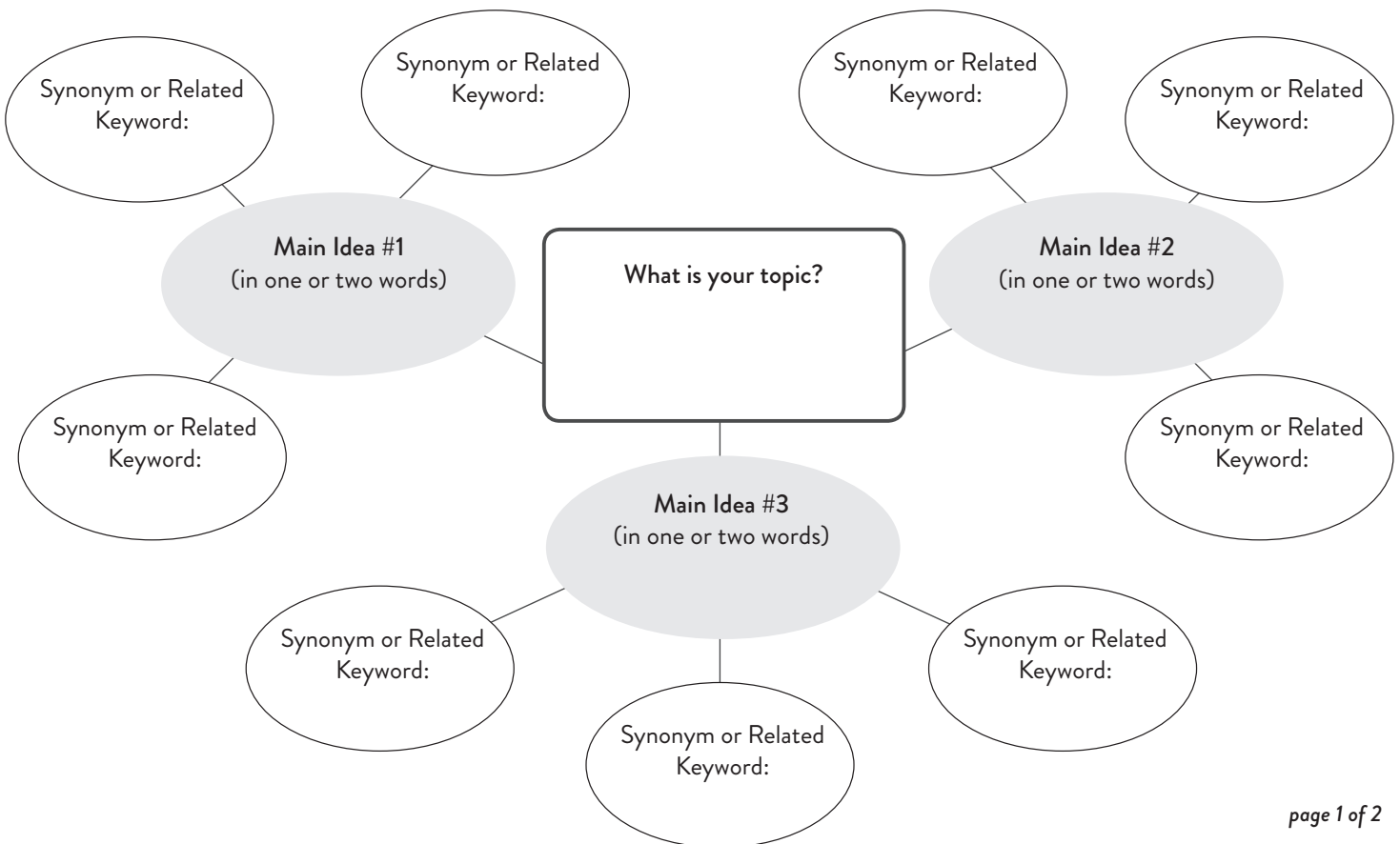


PROCESS WORKSHEET
