There have been several rulings by the Supreme Court of the United States that impact all of us. California State University, San Bernardino is a public university. We cannot build bridges if we refuse to acknowledge the chasms and valleys that still divide.

We are CSUSB. We are here to serve our community and one another. And these are our values.
