All eyes are still on CSUSB as we enter the new academic year and edge ever-closer to the opening of the all-new **Performing Arts Center**. The faculty and staff of the **CSUSB** Department of Theatre Arts would like to take a moment to thank former chair André Harrington for his years of service and guidance, and extend a warm welcome to new Department Chair Matthew Poole.

Professor Poole comes to us from the Communications and Visual Arts departments with years of leadership experience in both areas. With Professor Poole's guidance, the Department of Theatre Arts will begin it's next big transition: the opening of the Performing Arts Center in the 2026 Spring Semester.

This season will have us opening on the Barnes Stage with *Rhinoceros*, by Eugène Ionesco, directed by Terry Donovan Smith. Rhinoceros is an absurdist drama about the sudden rise of fascism and mob-mentality in a small town. *Rhinoceros* will play for 7 performances from November 14 - 21, 2025.

The end of the fall into the spring semester will see the *History in Harmony*, A Musical Theatre Touring production, setting down in the Barnes December 5-7, 2025 and the PPG's Other Theatre Project, and more leading to our seasons grand finale...

The Ellen Weisser Endowed Theatre Showcase presents the musical sensation -Little Shop of Horrors, Book By Howard Ashman, Music By Alan Menken, Lyrics By Howard Ashman and directed by Professor Kristi Papailler, tentatively scheduled to be the first production in our new Performing Arts Center from April 24 - May 3, 2026. 

Ellen Gaynor Weisser graduated from CSUSB with a bachelor's degree in English in 1968. She is the former chair of the College of Arts and Letters Community Leaders Board (2004-2015) and immediate past chair of the CSUSB Philanthropic Foundation. Ellen appeared as Shakespeare's Desdemona during the CSUSB 1967-1968 season in a production of short plays titled *Matches and Mismatches*. Her passion and enthusiasm for her alma mater are inspiring.

Ellen's husband, Stanley "Stan" Weisser, earned his R.Ph. from the University of Connecticut School of Pharmacy in 1963. Currently, he is a trustee of the University of Redlands. Stan is brilliant, warm, and dedicated to serving his fellow man.

On June 4, 2016, for their 50th wedding anniversary, Stan surprised Ellen with The Ellen Weisser Endowed Theatre Showcase honoring her service to CSUSB, the university's 50th anniversary, and most importantly, their golden wedding anniversary.
