PALM DESERT, Calif. — Starting Aug. 1, Cal State San Bernardino will be accepting undergraduate applications for the Spring 2026 term. First-time freshmen, as well as lower-division and upper-division transfer students, are encouraged to apply by the Sept. 15 deadline.
