



### ⚠ Important Travel Advisory for Undocumented Students ⚠

If you are undocumented, please be aware of the following:

**U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)** or **Border Patrol agents** may conduct stops of vehicles, including buses or vans, especially within 100 miles of the U.S. border. These stops may involve questioning about immigration status or requests for identification.

#### **What You Should Know:**

- ICE and Border Patrol have increased authority in certain areas, particularly near borders or checkpoints.
- Though school field trips are generally safe, undocumented students may be at **risk of detainment** if approached by immigration agents during travel.
- It is your **right to remain silent** and **not disclose your immigration status**. You are not required to carry or present any immigration documents unless you have them voluntarily.
- Please discuss possible risks with a trusted immigration attorney or advocate before agreeing to travel.

#### **Precautionary Steps:**

- Know your rights: You can refuse to answer questions and request legal counsel.
- Avoid carrying foreign identification (passports, consular IDs) if concerned about status disclosure.
- Speak with Recreation and Wellness staff administration about any concerns *before* the trip.
- Consider creating an **emergency plan** in case of detainment or separation.
