

## 🛕 Important Travel Advisory for Undocumented Students 🛕



If you are undocumented, please be aware of the following:

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or Border Patrol agents may conduct stops of vehicles, including buses or vans, especially within 100 miles of the U.S. border. These stops may involve questioning about immigration status or requests for identification.

## What You Should Know:

- ICE and Border Patrol have increased authority in certain areas, particularly near borders or checkpoints.
- Though school field trips are generally safe, undocumented students may be at **risk of detainment** if approached by immigration agents during travel.
- It is your right to remain silent and not disclose your immigration status. You are not required to carry or present any immigration documents unless you have them voluntarily.
- Please discuss possible risks with a trusted immigration attorney or advocate before agreeing to travel.

## **Precautionary Steps:**

- Know your rights: You can refuse to answer questions and request legal counsel.
- Avoid carrying foreign identification (passports, consular IDs) if concerned about status disclosure.
- Speak with Recreation and Wellness staff administration about any concerns before the trip.
- Consider creating an emergency plan in case of detainment or separation.
