1. **Upper-Division Non-Social Work (UD Non-SW):** Students can choose to enroll in:
 - SSCI 3060 (WI)
 - PA 3800, or
 - PSYC 3390
All three classes are required for the BASW program.
2. **Upper-Division General Education (UD GE):** Students can select courses from the [2026-2027 Academic Catalog](#) to meet the requirements for:
 - Mathematical concepts/quantitative reasoning or science
 - Arts or humanities, or
 - Social and behavioral sciences
3. **Social Work (SW) Elective:** Students need to enroll in an elective offered by the School of Social Work, that is, a course with a SW prefix (e.g., SW 5052). Students should enroll in a social work elective in their senior year. Title-IV-E students are required to complete SW 5038 as their social work elective.
4. **Upper-Division (UD) Elective:** To meet the upper-division elective requirement, students must select two upper-division courses from either within or outside the School of Social Work. However, these courses must not include any courses taken to satisfy a major, minor, or upper-division General Education requirements.
5. **Free Elective:** Students may enroll in any subject or course level if they have fulfilled all their General Education requirements. This elective is not required if the student has met the 120-unit minimum for graduation
