MINUTES

APRIL 10, 2018

The meeting was called to order by the Executive Vice President, Prince Ogidikpe at 12:05 p.m.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:

The minutes of April 3rd were approved.

REPORT:

Programming Student Assistant: Mr. Macias gave a brief report on programs for the month of March. Some of the events that occurred were open forums, A Dialogue with Dolores Huerta and the Khalid Concert. Sustainability week will be held from April 16th-22nd. ASI will be hosting a movie night on April 18th and will be showing the film Jumanji.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

M/S Felix/Azhand: To place BD 23-18 through BD 26-18 on a consent calendar. Passed (12/0/0).

The agenda was adopted as amended.

OPEN FORUM:

Ms. Coates, professor in Jack Brown, presented information about the Sustainability Show on Coyote Radio. She explained that the talk show launched in November 2017 and has one an airing per month. The overall goal of the Sustainability Show is embedded in the three E's – Education, Engagement and Entertainment. Within the next year, the show plans to expand in content, operations and advertising.

GUEST SPEAKER:

Dr. Karmanova, Dean of College of Extended Learning, gave a presentation on the 2018 Summer Session. The main reason for students who dis-enrolled from summer school was due to the financial costs of attending. A survey was e-mailed to students asking if they would have remained enrolled in summer school if they would have received financial aid and 92% of students stated yes. In addition to Federal Financial aid, there is also the Summer Assistance Grant (SAG) and the Graduate Initiative Grant (GIG) that will be available to students who need financial assistance for summer

school. Summer SAG, Pell and federal student loan awards are based on 2017-2018 academic year eligibility. Summer registration will take place on May 7th – June 14th and does not require prepayment or financial aid deferment.

Dr. Haynes stated that housing will be open and available to students during the summer.

Mr. Felix suggested collaborating with Dr. Karmanova and the Financial Aid office on creating a video to deliver summer financial aid information.

NEW BUSINESS:

BD 22-18 M/S Wachuku/Azhand: Approval of the Conflict of Interest Policy. (First Reading)

Mr. Barcenas briefly reviewed the changes to the policy. He explained that this policy applies to all individuals who hold an official ASI position. The California Education and Corporations Code have been incorporated in the policy. The Conflict of Interest Policy - Statement of Acknowledgment form was updated. This policy is currently being reviewed by Legal Counsel.
