2. Committee Page (*no page number*)
3. Copyright Page (*no page number*)
4. Abstract (*page iii*)
5. Acknowledgements (*optional, lowercase Roman numeral*)
6. Dedication (*optional, not numbered*)
7. Table of Contents (*numbered with lowercase Roman numeral*)
8. List of Tables (*If tables are included. Lowercase Roman numeral*)
9. List of Figures (*If figures are included. Lowercase Roman numeral*)
10. Chapter One: Journal Article (*Numbered page 1. Continue numbering consecutively through the end of the thesis.*)
11. Chapter Two: Conference Paper Proposal
12. Chapter 3: Conference Paper
13. References/Works Cited

Follow the university's formatting for type, headings, margins, etc., in chapter four of *A Guide to Graduate Studies: Policies, Procedures, and Thesis/Project/Dissertation Format*.
