

Comments Received on Draft Vision and Mission Statements, Core Values, and Strategic Priorities Presented at Dec. 2nd Campus Forum as of Dec. 4, 2014

Note: to differentiate from the draft language, comments are italicized

CSUSB Vision Statement (DRAFT)

CSUSB will be a premier comprehensive university of choice for students.

- CSUSB will be <u>the</u> a premier comprehensive university of choice for students. The Inland Empire [illegible] and globally.
- Be purposeful in your words! CSUSB <u>is</u> will be a premier comprehensive university of choice for students. When will we get there?
- CSUSB will be the a premier comprehensive university of choice for students success.
- CSUSB will be the a premier comprehensive university of choice for students success.
- CSUSB will be <u>the</u> a premier comprehensive university of choice for students. <u>National</u> <u>model for a...</u>.
- One comment underlined "of choice for students" with no additional explanation.
- "For students" seems a little exclusionary for what we're trying to do as a university. "University of choice" should be opened up to include the choice for faculty, for community, etc. as well.
- By adding student success to the Vision, it becomes a program and as a faculty member, that is something the commenter could support and it becomes more compelling.
- What does being "a" premier university mean? Commenter can understand being "the" premier university, but not "a" premier university because premier means first so there can't be more than one. Additionally, unsure of the meaning "of choice" of choice for what and for whom and it makes things unclear because "of choice" suggests incoming and "student success" suggests results and these two are different. Student success should be our focus.
- We could be "the" premier university in terms of student success.



• Concerned the Vision isn't very aspirational. Alternative approach: we would become a national model for a minority serving institution. Our demographics are the demographics for the nation's higher education in about 50 years and it is an opportunity for us to show how to produce excellent results to students elsewhere that are not served as well as they are here. Being a national leader is aspirational.

- Adding "diverse" as modifier of communities may be redundant.
- "Collegiality and inclusivity" are values so they should be listed in Core Values instead of in the Mission. Additionally, begin the Mission with "CSUSB will be a national model for universities serving disadvantaged and minority populations..."
