Purchase your parking permit

- There is not a grace period on campus. You will need to purchase a parking permit if you plan to park on campus. Once you purchase your permit, you will be emailed a temporary permit that is eligible for 10 days. Your parking permit will be mailed to you. If you live on campus, you can pick up your permit in the Parking and Transportation office in University Hall 039.

- To remove your holds, you will need to contact the office that placed the hold on your account. To see who is responsible for the hold, click Code next to the hold title and look under "Description". You can then contact the office that oversees that program/hold.

October 28 - Winter Advising Begins

- Schedule a meeting with your academic advisor for to prepare for your winter registration. You do not have to wait and this is *not* a deadline. Keep in mind, many other students are also trying to meet with an advisor. Don't delay!
