

TABLE 1: Participant Profile




OUR IMPACT

The OSR gathers data on the GPAs of the students participating in the Peer Lab and Peer Research Consultant programs.

The graphs below shows that the Peer Lab and Peer Research Consultant programs had an impact on the mean course grade GPA of the students who attended the peer sessions, comparing to their peers who did not. The difference shown below indicates that this impact was significant both for “All Students” and the “URM Students” participating in the Peer Lab or Peer Research Consultant sessions.

TABLE 2: Peer Lab and Peer Research Consultant Impact on the participant course GPA






NEW in 2017/18

The OSR held its first **Research Week** on May 14-18. During this week we held the first **Annual Faculty Mentors' Recognition Brunch**. The week also included student presentations during the annual "Meeting of the Minds." The students who were selected as the best oral and poster presenters were recognized during the first annual **Recognition of Student Researchers Luncheon**. In Spring 2018 The OSR created and published its first **Newsletter**, which featured student and faculty highlights.



2017/18 BUDGET

This year's OSR's budget totaled \$567,155 in the program and operating expenses. The sources of funding included the Academic Student Success Programs (ASSP) Fund, Strategic Analysis, the Student Success Initiative (SSI), and the Instructionally Related Activities (IRA). There was a total of \$252,646 in the funds awarded to support students, and a total of \$188,000 was allocated to support faculty.

Each year, the OSR hosts a variety of events that are designed to bring exposure to the research and creative projects being conducted by faculty and students on campus. The school year began with the annual **Taste of Research** event, which included faculty and student



guest speakers from various disciplines, who presented their research or creative projects in the form of oral or poster presentations at the Palm Desert campus.



In February of 2018, we hosted the CSUSB Student Research Competition, where students competed to qualify for the prestigious statewide Annual CSU Student Research Competition. Finally,

the year concluded with the annual "Meeting of the Minds" Student Research Symposium, where CSUSB graduate and undergraduate students had the opportunity to showcase their research and creative activities through oral and poster presentations.
