

Assessment Purpose


- To seek an understanding into the campus awareness of the alternate transportation options that are offered by Parking and Transportation Services
- To better educate the campus with regards to our alternate transportation options
- Seek feedback to improve the options we offer

- Assessment Methodology
 - Compiled and analyzed data from:
 - Annual SCAQMD survey results
 - Campus tabling session surveys
 - Survey Respondents
 - 1,234 Faculty and Staff (AQMD October 2018)
 - 1,127 Students, Faculty and staff surveyed (November 2018 -May 2019)


ANNUAL STAFF RIDERSHIP SURVEY

Assessment Findings

- Alternate transportation programs are ranked 4th (out of 5) as top concern regarding the Parking and Transportation program
- Free Omnitrans rides are the most known and used alternate transportation program
- Rideshare matching and incentives were the 2 least known alternate transportation programs offered by Parking and Transportation Services

- Implications for Practice
 - Form a campus wide "Transportation Committee"
 - Initiate a study for viable alternate transportation options for our campus community taking into account regional conditions
 - Increase marketing/awareness for online ride matching program and other alternate transportation programs
