Implications for Practice:

- 1. Interdisciplinary Science Lab Building Feasibility Study needed
- 2. Further study of how non-instructional spaces are scheduled and utilized is needed. Identify a process of gathering similar metrics used in analysis of state instructional spaces.
- 3. Department staffing projections are needed to plan for future Administrative and Faculty Office space needs.

Study Follow-up:

- 1. Interdisciplinary Science Lab Building Feasibility Study
 The campus contracted with HGA Architects to conduct the Feasibility Study and work with the College of
 Natural Sciences leadership began in October 2020. To date the study has identified the space needs of all
 departments within the College of Natural Sciences, we have had multiple open forums with faculty and
 students on the development of what is shaping up to be an approximately 100,000 GSF laboratory building.
 Work will continue through summer 2021 with plans to complete the study in Fall Semester 2021.
- 2. Space Utilization COVID and remote work options have revealed opportunities for space utilization. We have been working closely with the Space Planning Advisory Committee (SPAC) to complete inventories of assigned space. We plan to conduct an RFP solicitation this spring to conduct a space utilization study of administrative space that should begin upon campus repopulation in summer 2021. This initiative has been elevated and incorporated into the campus strategic plan extension and will be funded through that effort.
- 3. Space Projections and Planning We are working to develop divisional space planning committees to help address space need projections. A committee has been developed in Academic Affairs and we are working with Student Affairs now. The committee structure has been approved by the President's cabinet and will report to the SPAC. It is our goal to have these committees inform the overall campus space priorities in response to divisional and programmatic space needs.
